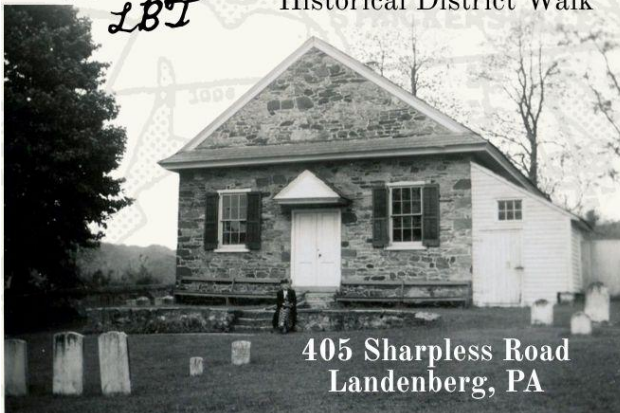

London Britain Township, nestled in the scenic hills of Landenberg, Pennsylvania, is preparing to mark a historic milestone, its 300th anniversary. Founded in 1725, the Township has evolved from a quiet colonial settlement into a vibrant community that honors its rich heritage, while embracing the future. With its deep ties to the Mason-Dixon Line, the scenic White Clay Creek and the historic Welsh Baptist Meeting House, London Britain Township has long been a place where history and nature intertwine.

To commemorate this tricentennial, the Township will host a celebration on **Saturday, September 27, 2025 from 11 AM to 4 PM** at Nichol Park. Bring a blanket or lawn chair to enjoy the festivities. This is a chance for the community to come together, listen to great local musicians, share stories and enjoy the charm that makes London Britain Township so unique.

An **11 AM Nature Walk** is planned as well as an historic walking tour at 2pm. Both walks will commence within the White Clay Creek Preserve (405 Sharpless Road). Do not miss the opportunity to walk back through history with members of the London Britain Township Historical Commission on the Welsh Baptist Historical District Walk.



Starting at the early 18th Century Meeting House next to the White Clay Creek Preserve office, the walk will give you a sense of pre-colonial and early colonial life in the area. Walk the land where indigenous people lived for thousands of years. Visitors will view the remnants of the John Evans House, built in the early 18th Century. It is one of the oldest homesteads in Chester County. See the final resting place of those who helped shape our Township and Country, including graves of those who fought for our independence in the Revolutionary War. Understand how the Mason Dixon Survey formed the boundaries of the areas we now call states. Experience how some of the early colonists and residents of our Township worked the land and creek to help sustain the farming and milling ventures that were a critical part of 18th and 19th century London Britain Township.

The walking tour and celebration will showcase the Township's enduring spirit and commitment to community. From local artisans to historical exhibits, attendees can expect a blend of entertainment and education which reflect the Township's character and offer a glimpse at what is on the horizon moving forward. Whether you're a longtime resident or a curious visitor, the event offers a meaningful way to connect with the past while celebrating the present and bold future.

As London Britain Township steps into its fourth century, the 300th anniversary is more than just a party—it's a tribute to generations of stewardship, resilience, and shared identity. With its picturesque landscapes and proud legacy, London Britain Township continues to be a place where history lives on and community thrives. Mark your calendars!
